What are UXO?

- UXO stands for UneXploded Ordnance.
 - Unexploded ordnance includes ammunition and explosive devices such as:
 - Bullets
 - Grenades
 - Mines
 - Bombs and bomblets
 - Missiles
 - Artillery shells

do not
pick it up!

UXO, Dud, Training Round, War Trophy, Souvenir
NO MATTER WHAT YOU CALL THEM! THEY CAN BE DEADLY!

Learn and Follow the **3Rs**

RECOGNIZE: The danger that a souvenir
munition poses to yourself,
your family and your neighbors

RETREAT: Do not disturb, touch or move it
Do not give or throw it away

REPORT: Call 911

Keep yourself and your children safe

- Teach your children what to do if they encounter UXO:
 - Recognize it.
 - Retreat (Leave the area via the same path you entered. I.e., backtrack)
 - Report it.

Recognize It

- UXO may not look like a bullet or bomb.
- UXO may look harmless, but they are all dangerous!
- UXO may be shiny or rusty.
- UXO may be clean or dirty.
- Even though UXO hasn't been moved for years, or you've moved it dozens of times, it may still explode.
- Leave it alone.

Retreat

- Leave the area the same way you entered the area.
- Don't touch UXO.
- Stay away.

Teach your children what to do if they find UXO

- Recognize it.
- Retreat: Leave the area the same way you entered the area.
- Report it.



Report It

Call 911

- Report UXO to your local law enforcement.
- Local authorities will clear the area.
- Trained explosive ordnance disposal (EOD) personnel will dispose of the item.





Be Safe

- Remember UXO can kill or seriously injure you and/or others nearby.
- Leave it alone.
- Get away from it.
- Report it to law enforcement immediately.
- Keep your children and yourself safe.
