

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)



With such a big and exciting event, there's naturally lots of questions. Here's a list of the most common questions to help with your Air Show experience.

What is Warriors Over the Wasatch?

The 2026 Warriors Over the Wasatch Air Show is June 27-28. Admission is free. Hill AFB is opening its gates to the public from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. to witness firsthand the pride and precision of the U.S. Air Force including a number of spectacular military and civilian aerial performers and demonstrations. Visit www.hill.af.mil/Warriors-Over-The-Wasatch for updates including a list of performers, parking and transportation information, an event map and more.

Is there a schedule of events?

Both days are generally designed to be the same. Visit www.hill.af.mil/Warriors-Over-The-Wasatch to view the performer lineup. You will note that times are not posted for each of the air show acts, because the lineup is subject to change without notice based on weather and other factors. However, visitors should expect to see non-stop performances both days. Apart from unforeseen schedule changes, the Thunderbirds will be the last act performed each day.

In case of rain or other inclement weather, will the show go on?

Weather may sometimes drive changes in the schedule, but the show will still go on. Only in the cases of the most severe weather would the base have to postpone some of the events on a given day. If there are any delays, the ground displays will still be available. If rain is in the forecast, then come prepared with appropriate clothing and protection from the elements.

What type of ID do I have to show to get on base?

There are no specific ID requirements to get into the airshow; however, all attendees are subject to search. We encourage all guests 16 years and older to have a valid form of ID. Drivers should also maintain proper vehicle registration and insurance documents as required by Utah law.

Will food, beverages and souvenirs be sold at the event?

Yes. There will be many different vendors selling a variety of foods, drinks and beverages. Free water stations are also located throughout the venue. Vendors will accept cash, credit and debit cards.



Will smoking be allowed?

For safety reasons, smoking will not be allowed inside the venue.

Are pets allowed at the event?

Aside from service animals, pets are not allowed at the event. Please leave your pets at home. Air shows are inherently loud and may cause discomfort to a service animal. Please consider this before bringing your service animal to the event.

What if I am separated from my child?

Families and groups are encouraged to stick together or to meet frequently at predetermined times and places. Alternately, a pre-arranged meeting place should be identified in case of separation. Wristbands will be available at each entrance to help connect lost children with their parents quickly. There will be a lost child/parent area at the event. In the event a child is separated from his or her parents, call the lost child booth at 801-777-FIND (3463).

Are there restrictions on what can be brought to the event?

Yes. Alcohol, non-prescription drugs, and weapons of any kind are prohibited. See the full list of prohibited/permitted items for more details.

Can I bring a cooler with food and water?

For security reasons, coolers are not allowed unless they are specifically needed for medications that require refrigeration or to hold infant food/beverages. Under those two approved situations, only small coolers are allowed.

Can I bring lawn chairs or tents?

The only chairs that will be permitted into the event will be small, space saving, fold-up chairs. Large and bulky lounge chairs are not allowed. Awnings or tents are not allowed to be set up at the event. Small personal umbrellas may be used.

Can I bring my bicycle to the event?

Bikes are allowed on the installation, but cyclists must wear a helmet when on the installation. There will be no designated bike racks for parking and bikes will not be allowed through the security portals into the event area.

What's the best way to get to and from the air show?

Utah Transit Authority is offering special pricing on FrontRunner and a free shuttle service to and from Clearfield FrontRunner Station to the show both days. The special pricing will be available starting June 3 at rideuta.com/airshow.



Is parking available on base for this event?

Parking on base is extremely limited for an event this size and show organizers highly encourage attendees to use public transportation to get to and from the event.

However, if you choose to drive to the show, vehicles must enter through Hill's West Gate (access from 650 N. in Clearfield or I-15 Exit 335) or North Gate (access from 5600 S. in Roy or I-15 Exit 338.)

The South Gate will be closed to the general public, except pedestrian foot traffic, which will still be permitted. Vehicles attempting to enter will be redirected to another entrance.

Upon entering the base, staff members will direct spectators where to park. Some parking lots are within walking distance to the entry portals. Some parking lots are too far to walk. In this case, complementary shuttles to the public entry portals will be provided.

Will off-base parking be offered?

Clearfield FrontRunner Station: Parking will available at the Clearfield FrontRunner Station with a free shuttle service to and from the Station to the show both days.

Weber State University Center for Continuing Education: Limited public parking is available at the Weber State University Center for Continuing Education, located at 775 S. University Park Blvd. A free shuttle service will be provided from this location.

Due to anticipated heavy traffic and traffic flow considerations, there will be limited shuttle service available from Northridge High School, located at 2430 N. Hill Field Rd. Alternatively, attendees may choose to walk on base from this location using Hill's South Gate.

Will handicap parking be available?

Limited handicap parking spaces will be available on base. Vehicles with handicap placards and license plates should enter through either the West Gate. Traffic attendants will provide instructions to these spectators and direct them to the appropriate parking area.

Are motorcycle riders allowed on base?

Yes. However, all motorcyclists are required to wear personal protective equipment, or PPE, including a helmet.
