HISTORICAL CORNER



The Amazing U.S. Army MIM-14 Nike Hercules Missile by Sam Stubbs

In 1944, U.S. Army Airforce planners reached a hard truth: radar-guided anti-aircraft guns were useless against high-altitude bombers. By the time guns could engage, the bombs were already falling. When the Soviet Union reverse-engineered the B-29 (TU-4) and detonated its first nuclear weapon in 1949, the need for a guided missile became urgent.

The Army moved fast. A team led by Bell Labs, Western Electric, and Douglas Aircraft won the contract to build the world's first surface-to-air guided missile - the Nike Ajax.

The Ajax was a game-changer. Flying at Mach 2.25 with a 25-mile range and a 70,000-foot ceiling, its 170-pound warhead could shatter TU-4 bomber formations. But the threat evolved quickly. Faster aircraft - the TU-16, M-4, and supersonic TU-22 - soon outpaced the Ajax.

Enter the Nike Hercules. Guided by Doppler radar and armed with a nuclear warhead, it could destroy entire bomber formations from up to 90-miles away. Later versions even added ballistic-missile defense and a surface-to-surface capability.

By 1963, 112 Nike Hercules batteries ringed U.S. cities and guarded strategic sites worldwide, including 12 NATO and Asian nations. The last Hercules stood down in 1988, replaced by Raytheon's mobile MIM-104 Patriot - so precise that nuclear warheads were no longer needed
